

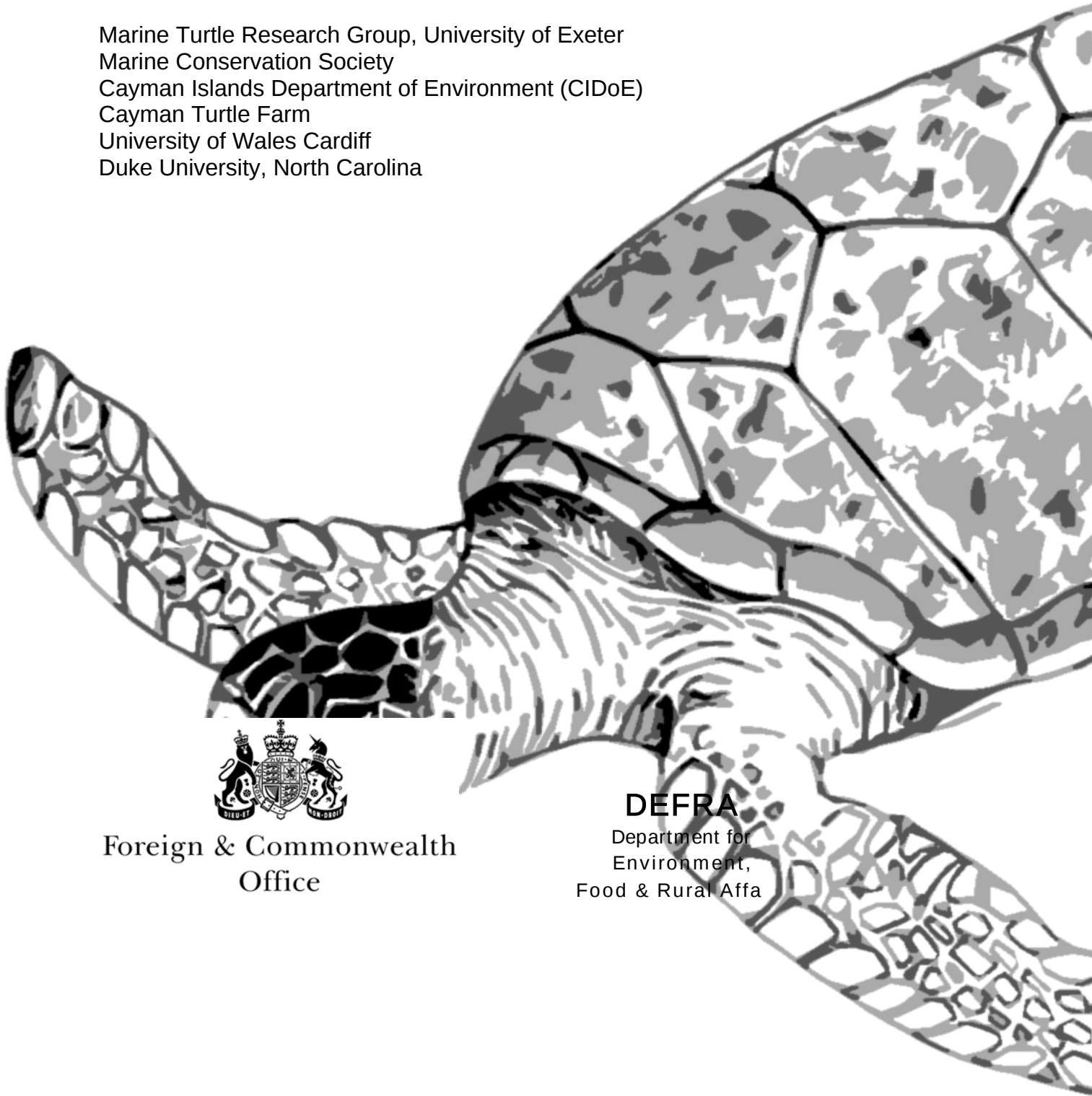
Bibliography of Marine Turtles in the UK Overseas Territories.
